The redesign of General Psychology at Frostburg State University was part of the system-wide initiative conducted by the University System of Maryland and NCAT. Megan Bradley will describe how the redesign team identified the problems they were trying to solve and how they launched their initial redesign. She will also discuss the redesign itself and the results they have achieved.

11:30 – 12:15 Case Study: Northern Virginia Community College Joyce Samuels, Dean, Natural & Applied Sciences Division, Loudoun Campus Northern Virginia Community College is redesigning their developmental math sequence as part of *Changing the Equation*, an NCAT program funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. A team of faculty, administrators and technology experts redesigned all developmental math courses offered at NOVA using the Emporium Model. Joyce Samuels will describe how the team identified the problems they were trying to solve and how they launched such a comprehensive, large-scale redesign across multiple campuses. She will discuss their successful approaches and results to date.
